

Brooklyn College Scholarship 2024-2025

The Brooklyn College Canada Scholarship Program is designed to support students who demonstrate exceptional academic talent, serve as exemplary role models, and make significant contributions to the overall school community.

Special Scholarship

Brooklyn College offers special scholarships for outstanding students who are in Grade

11 or below. Applicants must meet the following conditions:

- Won competition awards or subject expertise, such as: Olympic competitions, national/provincial subject competitions, English competitions, writing competitions, invention patents, etc. (relevant qualifications and certificates must be submitted for verification)

Rich experience in extracurricular activities, such as:

- High-quality volunteer activities, study tours to prestigious schools, Model United Nations, etc. (Participation certificates or institutional recommendation letters must be provided for verification)

Outstanding leadership skills, such as:

- Outstanding students, student club leaders, etc. (Participation certificates or institutional recommendation letters must be provided for verification)
- Students with literary or sports expertise. (Relevant qualifications and achievement certificates must be submitted for verification)
- Students with excellent academic performance, one of the above-listed expertise, an

IELTS score of no less than 6.5 (no less than 6 in each sub-score) or pass the Brooklyn College Scholarship Language Test, after the school interview and evaluation, Brooklyn College can award students a scholarship of up to 30,000 Canadian dollars!

Excellent Scholarship

If the student reaches IELTS 6.5 (no less than 6.0) or TOEFL 100 when enrolling, Brooklyn College will award the student a scholarship of 1,500 Canadian dollars. If the student reaches IELTS 7 (no less than 6.5) or TOEFL 105 when enrolling, Brooklyn College will award the student a scholarship of 5,000 Canadian dollars. If the student reaches IELTS 7.5 (no less than 7) or TOEFL 109 when enrolling, Brooklyn College will award the student a scholarship of 10,000 Canadian dollars.

Brooklyn College also offers other scholarship programs for current and graduating students. Students must meet the corresponding application requirements. For details, please consult the academic affairs teacher after admission.

1. Application Process and Scholarship Awarding

- 1) New students are required to provide official transcripts from their previous school upon admission.
- 2) Students need to submit relevant activity qualifications, recommendation letters, academic certificates, etc.
- 3) Submit a self-recommendation letter stating why they should be awarded the scholarship.
- 4) The school will select the best candidates from the self-recommendation letters submitted by the students and the scholarship committee will conduct an interview. The scholarship committee will decide on the award of the scholarship.

2. Students currently studying at our school need to meet the above academic standards.

- 1) Submit a self-recommendation letter stating why they should be awarded the scholarship.
- 2) The school will select the best candidates from the self-recommendation letters submitted by the students.
- 3) The scholarship committee will conduct an interview. The scholarship committee will decide on the

scholarship.

Students who receive the scholarship are required to pay the tuition fees for the entire academic year at the beginning of the academic year. If the student meets all the student requirements in the academic year, Brooklyn College Canada will deduct the tuition fees or directly deposit them into the student's tuition account after the end of the academic year, depending on the type of scholarship the student received, to offset other tuition fees or expenses that may occur in the school in the future. If the student has behavioral problems or receives a warning letter or suspension notice from the school during the academic year, the student does not meet the scholarship award requirements. If the scholarship recipient does not comply with the relevant regulations of Brooklyn College Canada, the student's scholarship will be cancelled.

The scholarship committee appointed by the school will decide on the award of the scholarship and will be based on the student's academic performance, behavior, contribution to the school community and the global community, and self-evaluation. Parents/guardians of students who receive the scholarship will receive formal notification from the school.

*The scholarship committee is composed of the principal, the admissions director and a teacher representative (the teacher must not be the applicant's teacher).

*Scholarships can be used to deduct tuition fees directly, or directly deposited into the student's tuition account to offset other tuition fees or expenses that may be incurred in the future at school.
